In my previous corporate life one of my staff members approached me with a folder full of information. He was new to his role and had been sifting through the old files of the person he'd replaced. **One folder, in particular, captured his attention.**

In that folder was information about a company who was interested in exploring new ways of attaching shingles to a roof. They wanted to develop a new kind of shingle which simply adhered to the tar paper, without the use of nails. With that in mind, they had approached the company some time ago and asked if we could help bring their idea to life.

The documents in the folder indicated that we had considered the idea and taken the time to research the market potential and found that it was a huge opportunity for an innovative approach.

As my eyes scanned the information, I began to grow excited about the possibilities. A partnership with this roofing company could open the door to major innovations, which could be used in other applications—anything involving strong adhesives that could stand the test of outdoor weather conditions.

- **1.** This proposal had been previously considered by a former manager and rejected.

So, I mulled it over. I weighed the pros and the cons. I studied the research.

Finally, I decided to do something BRAVE. I reached out to the company and asked if they were still interested in collaborating with us.

The rest, as they say, is history. The product we developed gain enormous popularity and led to the development of other innovations. We continued to partner with them for continued mutual gain.

The business continues to grow and has far exceeded all anticipated revenue projections...all because one employee had the courage to bring the opportunity to my attention and my team had the courage to act.

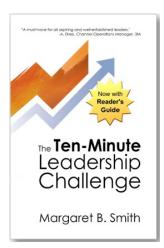
